Turner, Varney, Dysart and Wenzel called themselves Medical Specialists, LTD. at that time. They later changed their company's name to Associated Anesthesiology, Inc. The transition from "resident in training", to full time anesthesiologist in private practice, was the challenge I expected it to be. As to the day to day practicalities of managing an office where our business affairs were to be conducted, that concept had never occurred to me.
