



## ROBERT S. GOSE

January 21, 1918 - October 6, 2016

GOSE, Robert S., age 98, of Middletown, Ohio, passed away Thursday, October 6, 2016 at Atrium Medical Center where he had been a patient for two weeks. He was born January 21, 1918 in Mariba, Kentucky and moved to Ohio in 1946. He served in the U.S. Navy during W.W. II, in the South Pacific Theater. He was employed as a teacher of business at Monroe High School for four years. Then he was employed as a machinist in the Jet Engine Plant at G.E. for 30 years, retiring when he was 62 years of age. Robert was a member of First Baptist Church of Middletown and a 75 year member of Jefferson Lodge #90 F. & A.M. He was also a member of the Middletown Commandery #71 Knights Templar, Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Ohio Middletown Chapter 87, and the Grand Council Royal and Select Masons of Ohio Middletown Council 136. Preceding him in death were his parents, John Mason and Sarah Elizabeth (Egelston) Gose; his wife, Marjorie Smith Gose in 2001; one sister, Pauline Powers; and two brothers, Vernon and Willard Gose. He is survived by one daughter, Vickie Evans; one grandson, Aaron Sean Evans; and extended family and friends. A Celebration of Life Service will be held on Thursday, October 13, 2016 from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. at the Middletown Masonic Temple, South Marshall Road, Middletown.
