WILSON, William "Bill", age 81, of Middletown, Ohio passed away Saturday, January 17, 2015 at Hawthorn Glen Senior Living Campus. He was born December 9, 1933 in Booneville, Kentucky and moved to Ohio in 1948. He graduated from Lebanon High School in 1953, and served for eight years in the U.S. Army, during the Korean Conflict. He was barber and a carpenter by trade, and owned and operated Hatton's Barber Shop in Middletown for over 25 years.
